When you purchase our optional trip cancellation and trip interruption insurance and then miss part of your trip due to a covered delay (such as inclement weather or equipment failure of a common carrier), you will be reimbursed for the missed portion of your trip, as well as out-of-pocket expenses up to a total of \$500 per person.
